Safe Travelling Conversations



It is very encouraging seeing so many students walking or wheeling to school. Wadestown is a difficult suburb for pedestrians, particularly with so many narrow roads and footpaths.

The students are being encouraged to consider other users and follow the 'Keep to the Side' rule when passing other pedestrians. Ensuring they are keeping to the far side of the footpath will avoid the temptation to step onto the road, particularly when the space is limited.

Please remind your children about their responsibility as pedestrians, and even more so when they are drivers of a scooter. Please also ensure they leave home with a helmet on their heads.



FIXiT App for reporting problems to the WWC

Wellington City Council's smartphone app, FIXiT, gives Wellington residents, businesses and visitors a quick way to let us know about problems they see that need fixing around the city. This includes things like street lights that aren't working, graffiti, dumped rubbish, and damaged street signs.

The free app allows you to take a photo, tag the location on Google maps and leave a description of the problem. Once sent, the message is logged with their contact centre and the right staff notified. You will also receive a follow-up email.
