School Organisation 2020

We are now in the early stages of planning our School Organisation for 2020 and would appreciate the following important information from families please.

We will then arrange for families to complete a Wadestown School Pre-Enrolment form which can be found on the Wadestown School website <http://www.wadestown.school.nz/wp-content/uploads/2017/08/Pre-Enrolment-Form.pdf> This pre-enrolment form is essential for the school to have now, as it assists us to plan an effective and sustainable School Organisation that is in the best interests of all students.

Please note the number of 5 year olds intending to enrol at Wadestown School in 2020 significantly affects the organisation throughout the entire school, so your assistance with this task is greatly appreciated.

If your child will not be returning to Wadestown School in 2020, could you please let me know by emailing me confidentially at sally@wadestown.school.nz no later than **1 November 2019**.

In early Term 4 this year, we will begin planning the overall class structures throughout the school at both sites. Naturally the numbers of students we have at each year level varies and this needs to be taken into consideration when we determine how many classes and teachers we will require at each year level. The next step is for our teaching staff to begin the process of class placements throughout the school. Much time, thought and effort goes into this process and the decisions that are made are always based on what we believe is in the best interests of individual students.

We had a number of students represent Wadestown School in the Western and Interzone swimming sports this term. Highlights were the Year 4 Boys and Year 6 girls winning their relay races. The large number of students progressing from the Western Zones through to the Interzones, and the energy and excitement displayed by all our competitors.

Aims Games – 7 – 13 September 2019

Last week, 25 senior students were off in sunny Tauranga, at the 2019 AIMS Games. AIMS Games is an international sporting competition held every year in Tauranga. It is a huge event with over 11,500 athletes from 369 schools and it was the first time Wadestown School has ever competed. Over the course of the week the teams competed in boys football, girls football and even cross country on Sunday!



On the first day at Aims Games, we had 6 girls racing in the Cross Country event. All the girls who weren't competing also went along to support the team. The Year 7 girls were the first event we were competing in. After an intense race against 176 students, Abby Morton came 60th and Sophie Jones came 66th! Now it was time for the Year Eight girls to compete in another gruelling race. Kate Chandler placed 64th, Kyra Morgan placed 58th, Tori Angus came 48th and Poppy Healy came 20th, out of a 166 athletes. They all raced brilliantly and everyone who watched thought they did exceedingly well! The last event we competed in was the mixed relay. Everyone competed in this all girls team! We came 10th out of 18 schools and were very pleased with our result!

From Monday through to Friday the football teams competed in several games with determination and excellent sportsmanship. We were up against many Intermediate Schools with 700+ students and managed to give them a good challenge, with the girls coming 12th out of 34, and the boys coming 39th out of 60. Leading up to the Aims Games we all trained incredibly hard and when it came to our first games, the girls and boys teams came out with a bang, the girls were even top of the table for a day. After a long journey of wins, losses, ups and downs and two huge final games, both teams were incredibly tired but also extremely happy with their final placings. We left the soccer grounds with pride, smiles and an amazing placing for our first ever Aims Games. We had gone out hard and strong and made some lifelong memories!

Helen Dammer – Assistant Office Manager


