Dear Parents and Caregivers,

It has been another busy fortnight both inside and outside of the classroom. The students and teachers continue to work hard across the school. Once again there is much to celebrate and acknowledge.

Thank you all for your support on Monday with **Teacher Only Day**. The teachers appreciated having the additional time to focus on assessment and report writing. These days were introduced through the Accord which was an agreement reached by the Ministry of Education and NZEI (the teacher's union) to provide teachers with additional days. As per the Accord, the focus of our day was on "strengthening teacher's understanding of assessment tools for learning and teaching".

I have had stunning reports from the teachers who accompanied our students to the **Western Zones Athletics** last Friday. We are extremely proud of every student who attended and the results that were achieved on the day (further information provided below). I know our students were hugely focused and gave it their absolute all! Furthermore, what stood out to the teachers who accompanied our students was the conduct of our students on the day and the way they represented Wadestown School.
