Never fear – the Board will be meeting this need with online surveys over the next few months to prepare our School's strategic plan for formal community consultation.

A review of our Strategic Plan is a regulatory requirement.

Our Board is of the view that our strategic plan has guided the school very well and, without pre-judging any views of the community, is especially keen to carefully adapt the current plan to expressly embrace even more inclusivity at our wonderful school while continuing the School's outstanding record of providing excellent academic, sporting and other educational outcomes.

We welcome any input from any parents or caregivers regarding what educational outcomes or values ought to be prioritised over and above what is set out in the Act and on how school resources ought accordingly, be allocated. We look forward to acting on those views and adapting the strategic plan as a result. As examples, we have had suggestions already on further increasing resourcing of music, Te Reo, climate change science, speech and drama and STEM subjects. Amanda has already begun to capture some of our student's views - and working with our teaching staff, and following further consultation events and methods we hope to have a near final plan in place by Easter – please get involved!

Working towards on-site after and pre-school hours care at Wadestown School

The Board has resolved to investigate the putting into place, subject to the myriad of practicalities involved, a first-class on-site after and pre-school care programme to better meet the changing needs of our students and their families. Any offering resulting from this mahi will be commissioned by the School, be on a user-pays basis, be operated at arm's length to Wadestown School and will be rolled out in a staged and careful way. The Board's first obligation is, of course, to oversee an effective and successful School: accordingly our efforts in this regard and the programme itself will be subordinate to, and not adversely impact on the operation of the School, nor

interfere with the teaching practice of the Staff - we are however fortunate that certain factors mean that threading that particular needle should be very possible at our School - or at least that is what we hope.

The Board is also mindful of the existing after school care eco-system and we will be treading lightly as Wadestown School investigates putting in place its own offering.

Our initial draft/"kick around" operating model envisages care being provided at the Main School for students of all ages.

Property Update

The property projects at school are steaming ahead. At Rose St, the "nature play" area near the top of the school is scheduled for January and the new playground is scheduled for installation in February. The board is working to finalise the details for the new astro-turf and sports areas and installation of these is planned shortly after the new playground. We will be working further with staff and with students about their preferred use of sporting areas before the details are finalised.

The investigation and scoping work for the refurbishment of the Rata block is underway. This is a large project requiring extensive engineering, roofing and architectural investigations.

The building of the new external walkway between the upper and lower parts of the school has started. This is another large job that will continue throughout the holidays and into February.

Work already completed at Weld St includes the new fence and the new lines on the asphalt. Planter boxes are planned for Weld St and we hope these can be installed early in 2021.
