There is a real buzz across the school as staff and parents work together to prepare this year's Matariki celebration. Matariki is the Maori New Year and for the first time ever, this has been recognised with its own national holiday on Friday 24 June. For us at Wadestown, we are hoping to build on the success of last year's Matariki breakfast. In talking with whānau about their highlights for 2021, last year's celebration is often referenced and something that everyone enjoyed being a part of. This year, we are once again committed to coming together as a community to reconnect with one another.

Yesterday saw our students from the Pohutukawa Team (Years 1 - 2) visit the Dowse Art Gallery in Lower Hutt as part of their learning about Matariki. The students were invited to make their own Matariki lantern; possibly some children will bring these with them to our upcoming celebration. Thank you to those parents who accompanied the teachers on this trip.




We have seen the return of our Rose Street Assemblies part way through this term, and once again, it feels as though these events are providing our students with an opportunity to collectively celebrate their learning and their achievements. This week's Assembly, led by our stunning student leaders, saw students from each class from across the school, reflecting on our school values. Using our value of 'Gratitude' each student shared what they were grateful for. Many students spoke of their gratitude for the opportunities available to them at school, while others reflected on how fortunate they are to have a number of the home comforts that many others (across Wellington, NZ and the world) are unable to access. RIVER
GOES
WITH
ME Johnson Witehira
& Julie Nagam

Water is a constant—a physical and spiritual connection to all peoples. This shared experience is at the heart of this exhibition, a collaboration between Wellington-based Johnson Witehira (Ngāpuhi, Tamahaki) and Winnipeg-based Julie Nagam (Métis, German, Syrian).

This immersive installation highlights the life-giving qualities of water as a metaphor and a unifying element to bridge geographical distance and cultural tradition. Featuring imagery from both artists' tūrangawaewae (standing place), this exhibition draws on their combined visual languages, imagining a space where time and place converge.

Their rivers play an important role in this work, which is depicted as a kōwhaiwhai watercourse moving around the gallery space. Witehira draws on the deep connection he shares with the Whanganui River, the first body of water in Aotearoa recognised as a person. Nagam references the Red and Assiniboine Rivers, two interconnected waterways, which come together in the heart of Winnipeg, in the Manitoba territory of Canada.

A circle of stones transported from Pipiriki on the banks of the Whanganui, offers a tangible link back to these waterways. This element as well as imagery of pou (figurative carvings) illustrated in the Whanganui style are placed in conversation with distinctive features from the landscape Nagam calls home such as birch and red pine trees, the whip-poor-will bird, blue dragonfly and coyote (known as the prairie wolf).

Utilising hand-drawn elements alongside digital printing, rendering, animation and a specially created soundscape, *My River Goes With Me* is a multi-layered experience that provides an insight into these artists' shared vision.

The installation will be exhibited at Urban Shaman, Winnipeg and The Dowse Art Museum.

In anticipation of the popularity of this event, this year's event will look slightly different to our 2021 Matariki Breakfast celebration. Planning for this year's event has taken into account the current Covid climate and the inability for us to be able to socially distance in the hall.

Please join us on the bottom quad in front of Rooms 16 and 17. Students, parents and staff are encouraged to dress warmly and to bring their own 'keep cup' and blanket with them. Hot drinks (inclusive of hot chocolate and marshmallows) will be available and students are also invited to bring a torch if they wish.

Whānau can also enjoy a hot sausage from the BBQ for a koha donation or can BYO breakfast picnic. The money raised from the sausage sizzle will go towards the purchase of t-shirts for our Kapa Haka group.

Mid-Year Reporting to Parents

Teachers are currently writing reports for students. Each child will receive their own report ahead of the upcoming Three Way Conferences. I would encourage you to attend these with your child; as this provides an opportunity for students to discuss with both their parents and their teachers how

they are progressing in reading, writing and mathematics at this point in the year. Further information about how to book a Three Way Conference, will be shared with you all shortly.

Upcoming Swimming Lessons - Term 3

Next term will see all students participating in swimming lessons at Johnsonville Pool as part of the PE and Health Curriculum. This is a piece of work that Cathrine Wilkinson has been working on and we are pleased to have secured both the pool booking and the instructors for this year. Further details about what these lessons will involve will be shared shortly. The lessons will be pitched to meet the individual needs of each child; meaning that if your child is already a confident swimmer, they will also be provided with opportunities that meet their needs.

Te Reo Lesson with Matua Alwyn Rees

We are delighted to share that we now have a dedicated Te Reo teacher across the school. Each class will be working with Matua Alwyn to extend their use and understanding of Te Reo and Te Ao Maori, on a fortnightly basis. Alwyn visited each class on Tuesday accompanied by two of our Year 8 Leaders; Paige Pearce and James Van Der Zouwe. Alwyn works across a number of local schools including Khandallah, Cashmere Avenue and Johnsonville Schools. As well as working with our students, Alwyn will be working alongside our kaiako (teachers) to support them in their reo-learning journey. Alwyn is a hugely experienced teacher who bases his language learning around oral language. Having worked with him myself previously, I know that the students really engage with his lessons.

Playground Craze - Pokemon Cards

The current playground craze appears to be pokemon cards and I am aware that students are inclined to want to bring them to school to play with or to trade with others. Like with all 'playground crazes', there is a current frenzy around these cards.

A friendly reminder that if students choose to bring these cards to school, it is at their own risk. Teachers cannot be responsible for the loss or damage of personal property. Please remind your child of this and help them to make a decision that best suits them.

Road Patrol - Driver Behaviour

During the winter months we are faced with increased rain and high winds. On a few occasions, we deem it necessary for our students to do Road Patrol duty without the signs.

In such conditions, and for the safety of our students, we require parents and caregivers to drive with **extra caution and reduced speed**.

Rose Street Site Drop Off Zone

When using the Drop Off Zone on Mairangi Road, please do not leave your car as this causes a backlog of cars and can pose a danger to students who are exiting or entering our Rose Street entrance. Where a teacher feels a parent has been waiting for an extended period of time, it is reasonable for them to request that you move off.

Road Safety for our Children - Upcoming Community Consultation

I am currently working with a group of staff and parents to review Road Safety here at Wadestown School. This piece of work has been an ongoing one, and it aims to understand:

1. How do our students travel to and from school?
2. How do our parents support our students to travel to and from school?
3. How safe our students are on our roads e.g. at pedestrian crossings?
4. What we could do differently as a schooling community to increase the safety of our students?

We would like to encourage all parents to complete this survey to help provide us with the most up-to-date data and information possible.

Winter illness and RSV

Cold, flu and other respiratory viruses including respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) are common in schools and early learning centres during winter. These illnesses can be easily spread by sneezes or cough droplets.

RSV infections may progress to cause pneumonia and bronchiolitis, especially in infants.

Common symptoms:

- a runny nose
- coughing or sneezing

- fever
- wheezing and difficulty breathing
- loss of appetite
- difficulty feeding due to breathlessness

Remember:

- Anyone who is unwell should stay at home until they are symptom free and feeling well. Your child should not return to school or early learning until 24 hours after their symptoms (cough, runny nose) have gone.

- Wash and dry hands thoroughly and often to stop the spread of illness.
- Shortness of breath or abnormally rapid breathing always requires immediate medical attention.

WINTER ILLNESS

Colds, flu and other respiratory illness are common in schools during winter. Here are some simple tips to prevent the spread of illness:

- Wash and dry hands thoroughly and often including after blowing your nose, coughing and sneezing, and after using the toilet.
- Cough and sneeze into a tissue or your elbow, not your hand.
- Regularly clean high touch surfaces – door handles, taps, table tops, phones, computer keyboards, etc.
- Anyone who is unwell should stay at home until 48 hours after symptoms have gone.
- Get a flu vaccination at your family doctor or pharmacist. Vaccination can protect against certain viruses. COVID-19 vaccination is available for all over the age of 5 years. Annual flu vaccination is available and funded for some children.
