TE WHAKATIPU ME TO HONOHOHO HEI AKONGA: GROWING AND CONNECTING AS LEARNERS

Kia ora koutou,

As we begin to look forward to the upcoming Board elections, I want to pause and reflect on the work this current Board has achieved in their term as our School Board.

My first introduction to the Board was at my interview for Principal. At that time, I recall thinking that this was a Board that genuinely cared about and put the students of Wadestown School at the centre of their decision making. Under Mark Crofskey's leadership as Presiding Member/Board Chair, this Board has been one who has maintained a culture of collaboration and inclusion. Our Board meetings have seen everything from robust discussions to thoughtful reflection about the direction of the school and what we want for our students and teachers, now and into the future. In early 2021, we became a member of the Kāhui Ako and this partnership has extended not only across the school but to our Board who were keen participants in the Hautu Tool PLD with all other Boards from our local primary and secondary schools.

There has also been significant work done by our Board around property upgrades and developments, employment (with the appointment of key staff, DP, Office Manager, teaching staff, and a Te Reo teacher), the effective and ongoing management of Covid and the work we have done to raise Te Reo and Te Ao Māori across the school.

As a chair, Mark has been a listening and thoughtful ear. He has calmly responded to a wide variety of situations and has supported the Board, Senior Leadership Team and I to navigate the more complex and challenging situations. Not one conversation has gone by, when he hasn't asked about the students and whether they are engaged and happy at school and I have sincerely appreciated his commitment to our students' wellbeing.

Being a part of a School Board can be many things and often it isn't quite what people think it will be. You can never predict what might happen or pop up out of the blue!

Much has been achieved and I believe that a legacy of building cultural capability, honouring the Treaty of Waitangi, and inclusion is one the things that we are proudest of achieving.

Thank you for your ongoing parental assistance and feedback with our swimming lessons. Our students are highly enjoying the lessons.

So, it's the end of an era and the beginning of a new chapter.




