Wadestown School's success at the 2022 NIWA Science Fair











Mathswell is an annual competition run by the Wellington Maths Association, where students across Wellington compete for a trophy in teams of six. Before the night, we spent a few weeks practising with our reserves, who we really appreciate putting in so much work to train with us. On the night, when we made it to Hutt International Boys School, there were 40 other teams there. There were a few warm-ups before the competition, and then we started. Split into teams of three, we all did two sets of questions each: the problem solving for 15 minutes and the multichoice for only 10 minutes. We made it past the qualifying round to compete for the trophy and then had two rounds to go. After submitting our last page of questions, we watched the leaderboard change and hoped for the best. Then, after much discussion and waiting, we heard our results. Wadestown won second place! Together, we collected our prizes and congratulated the other teams. We consider ourselves very privileged to have had this amazing opportunity to improve our mathematics skills and work under time pressure. As a team, we did very well representing Wadestown, as we are a lot smaller than many of the other teams competing. Congratulations to our Mathswell team for this big achievement.


