The teachers have been busy writing mid-year reports over these past weeks and I have been enjoying reading about the progress our students have been making. Reading the reports serves as a great reminder of the rich and diverse curriculum opportunities our students are given and the hard work that each of our teachers put into getting to know all of their students as individual learners. Furthermore, they highlight the work that our students have been applying to their learning in the first part of the year. The reports will be shared with whānau at the end of next week, and then in the final week of the term, there will be an opportunity to discuss your child's learning with their classroom teacher at our Three Way Conferences.

The Leadership Team are continuing to work with the RTLB (Resource Teachers of Learning and Behaviour) to unpack what Structured Literacy could look like at Wadestown School. This is exciting work as we engage in professional discussions about the best ways of supporting our students in Literacy.

When undertaking professional development such as this, it requires our teachers to be both open to learning and open to reflecting on their teaching practice and the impact it has on their learners. These conversations have been exciting and at times, challenging but by keeping our learners at the centre of what we do, we are focused on developing a stronger pedagogical approach that will benefit everyone. As one of the first parts of this work, our teachers will be assessing all our students to find out what level they are working at. We look forward to sharing more about our learning, as our journey progresses.

Acknowledgement of Parental Assistance and Support

We had a fantastic PTA meeting on Monday evening and it was encouraging to see a number of new parents attending for the first time. Thank you to Michelle, Danielle, Heidi and Matthew for their ongoing, collective leadership of the PTA. As a team, you continue to work tirelessly for our students, teachers and the wider school. Your work is very much appreciated.

A big thank you to all the parents who have recently attended school trips or sporting events. Your attendance at these events make these trips possible and ensure that our students have the best possible experiences.

Reporting to Parents - Mid-Year Reports 2023

Our mid-year reporting process will be completed by the end of next week. Your child will come home with a report that outlines their progress since the beginning of the year, in reading, writing and mathematics. An OTJ (overall teacher judgement) is used to report against these core-curriculum areas. At Wadestown School we also report on the Key Competencies (as per the New Zealand Curriculum) and provide a summary statement of your child's work to date.

Upcoming Parent Teacher Conferences - Tuesday 27 and Thursday 29 June

Please ensure that you have made appointments for each of your children. These conferences are 15 minutes in length and we believe that this provides a good amount of time to discuss your child's learning. If you have other concerns or issues that you wish to discuss with your child's teacher, we encourage you to make a separate time to meet.

This year, due to the higher number of students in Kōwhai (Years 7 - 8), Cathrine, Emily and James will begin their interviews at 2:00 pm. All other teams will begin their conferences at 3:30 pm.

Out of Zone Enrolment for July to December 2023

APPLICATIONS OPEN

The Wadestown School Board invites applications from “out of zone” parents who wish to enrol their children at Wadestown School for Terms 3 and (intake 17 July to 15 December 2023). Enrolment at the school is governed by an enrolment scheme, details of which are available from the school office or at www.wadestown.school.nz. Students who live in the home zone are entitled to enrol at the school.

Limited places are available in the following areas of the school.

1. 5 Out of Zone New Entrant places
2. 2 Out of Zone places in Year 1
3. 2 Out of Zone places in Year 2
4. 2 Out of Zone places in Year 3

Where there are more applications for enrolment than there are places available the Board are required to fill any vacant out of zone places by ballot.

Applications from out of zone students will be processed in the following order of priority:

- Priority will be given to applicants who are siblings of current children at the school.
- Priority will then be given to applicants who are siblings of former children of the school.
- Priority will then be given to applicants who are children of Board employees.
- Priority will then be given to other applicants.

If the number of out of zone applications exceeds the number of places available, selection will be by ballot. If a ballot for out of zone places is required, it will be held on **Monday 26 June 2023** under external supervision. Parents will be informed as to the outcome of the ballot immediately following the ballot being held.

The deadline for receipt of applications for out of zone places is 12pm, Friday 23 June 2023.

Onslow College Learning Support Open Evening


The Onslow College Learning Support team would like to welcome all those who are interested to a Learning Support Open Evening.
