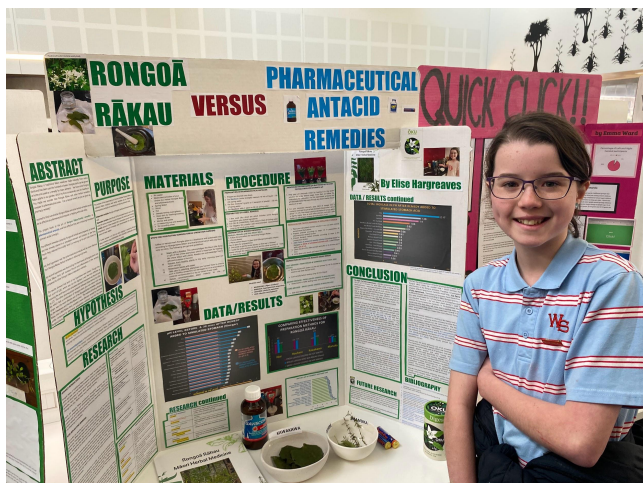
NIWA SCIENCE FAIR SUCCESS FOR WADESTOWN SCHOOL

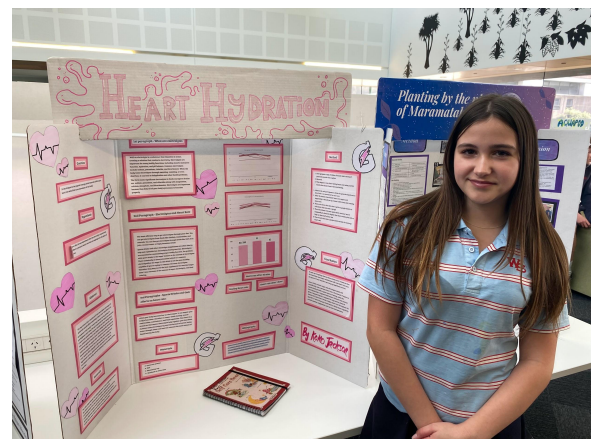
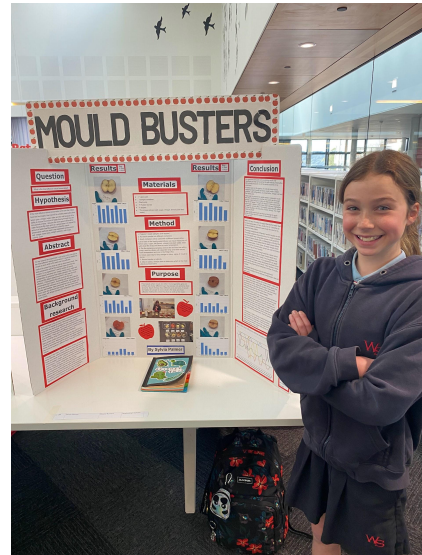
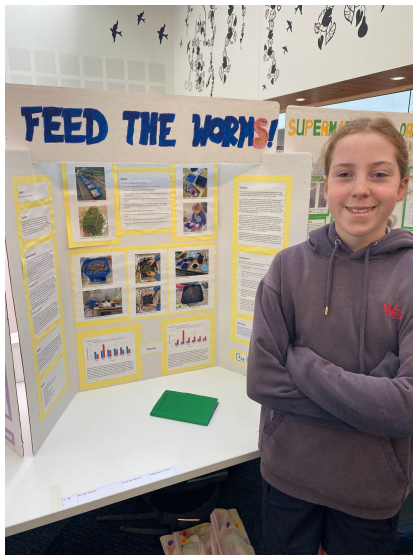
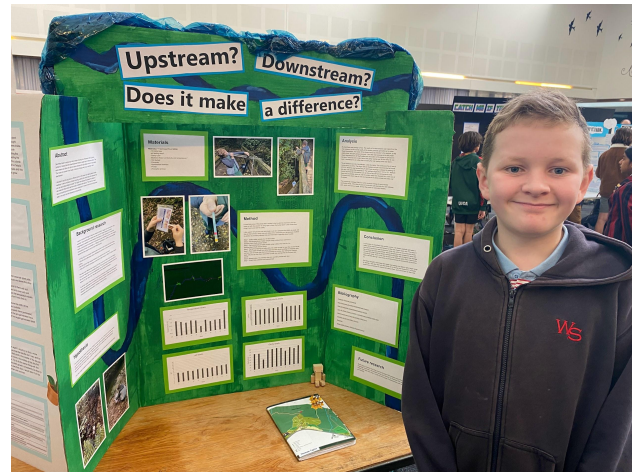
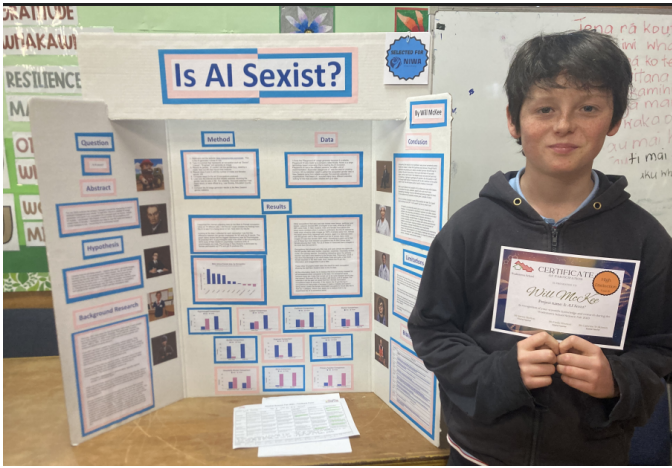

These students had put a huge amount of effort into their projects and now they had come to compete against the rest of the greater Wellington region. I was one of these students, so let me tell you my experience. Arriving at 9:00 a.m., we walked past tonnes of amazing Science Fair projects. I settled in beside my board and waited. Judges passed by, admiring Wadestown's stunning projects. Waiting was nerve wracking, but when the judges came to talk to us they were friendly and inquisitive about our projects. It was a great experience and Wadestown School collected 13 prizes, which was the largest number of prizes won by a single school. WELLINGTON MATHSWELL COMPETITION

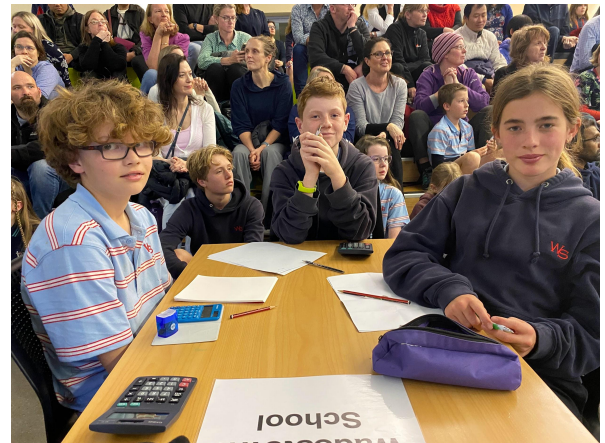
Last Wednesday night, 12 Kōwhai students went to compete in the Wellington Mathswell competition, which was held at Victoria University. We entered two teams of six (split into groups of three) into the competition. There were 57 other teams who had also entered the competition.

The room was filled with excitement and anticipation as we tried our hardest on all the questions. Each group did a problem-solving challenge and a set of multiple-choice problems. The problem-solving questions came one at a time and the whole group worked on it together. We had two chances to answer each question and 15 minutes in total to answer 13 questions. During the multi-choice section, we had three sheets of paper, which we split so each person had a sheet. We had 5 minutes to answer the first 6 questions and another five minutes to do the other nine. Everyone did extremely well and it was a great team effort.

After the first round, all the teams were divided into two competitions. The Cup and the Plate competition. The Cup Competition was for the people who ranked 1-20 in the first round. We made it through to this round. Although we were not placed on the podium, we were very close, with our results being very near to the eventual winners.

Overall, it was a great night. We did really well and tried our best.

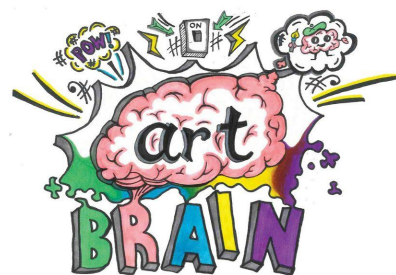
