Structured Literacy - Professional Development

The teachers and I enjoyed an engaging session on 'Structured Literacy' last Friday, during our final Teacher Only Day. We invited a guest speaker; Marianne Brown, to work with the teachers on a number of different aspects of Structured Literacy. Marianne works at Central North School in Palmerston North. As a highly experienced teacher Marianne began her own learning journey around Structured Literacy over 8 years ago. As an intervention teacher and parent of a child with dyslexia, Marianne's experience and insights were invaluable to us.

Marianne's focus is on the science of the brain in relation to student's learning to read. Our time with her included sessions on; dyslexia, the impact and importance of intervention in supporting students to learn to read, the explicit teaching of handwriting and the importance of deliberate and explicit instruction in reading and writing to accelerate students in their learning.

We are thrilled that Marianne has agreed to return to work with us all again, at the beginning of next year.

End of Year Reports

My sincere thanks to our teachers, Team Leaders and Cathrine and Robyn for their work on the end of year reports. These will be issued in the final week of the term.

This year an email will be sent out to all parents the day before the issuing of reports to explain the curriculum levelling that informs our Overall Teacher Judgements (OTJs). Please look out for this.

School Uniforms

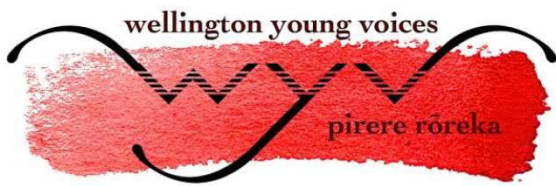
