Last Thursday the teachers and I had the opportunity to participate in our Kāhui Ako Teacher Only Day. We listened to key speaker Dr Nina Hood who examined the current educational landscape and unpacked the key challenges and opportunities that we are facing today.

A key focus of this day centred around the teaching of writing and the development of a shared rubric for all schools within our Kāhui Ako. This piece of work is an exciting development and one that has taken over a year to create. For us as a school, it provides us with an opportunity to gauge where our students sit against other students of the same age in writing. It also provides us with further opportunities to begin to understand the expectations of our local Colleges and where they need our students to be at the beginning of Year 9 to ensure future success.

Additionally, all teachers were able to select workshops that centred around the key goals of; well-being, culturally sustaining pedagogy and student agency. I attended an excellent workshop by a teacher who took us through strategies for enhancing student and staff well-being.

Thank you parents and caregivers for giving our staff this opportunity for further teacher development and growth. We hope the extended Easter break provided you all with quality time with friends and family.

## **Driver Behaviour and Student Safety**

I have had a number of parents approach me over the past few weeks raising their concerns about driver behaviour and student safety. This has been in relation to both our Rose and Weld Street sites.

A number of staff and parents have witnessed dangerous driving and/or parking that is putting a number of our students unduly at risk.

I urge all parents to take caution when driving and most especially around our students. It is our collective responsibility to ensure we create a safe environment for our students when they walk to and from school. Parents and staff should not have to call out unsafe driver behaviour.

This serves as a reminder to all parents to:

- 1. Keep to the speed limit
- 2. Park only in areas designated for parking
- 3. Use the Road Patrol crossing to cross the road and to role model safe behaviour on our roads
- 4. Keep to the time limits in our drop off zones.

If you see poor driver behaviour, please continue to let me know. Thank you to those of you who are doing the right things by our tamariki.

## Madagascar: The Musical National Tour 2024



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## Ngā Manu Holiday Fun

**Come join us on Tuesday 23<sup>rd</sup> April** at 11am for a very special puppet show by the extremely talented String Bean Puppets:

"Flutter" A short tailed bat who is afraid of the dark is befriended by a sparkly glow worm who thinks she is a star. The show is for 3-10 year olds. It's about over coming your fears and includes some of Aotearoa's unique fauna and flora and the threats they face. The threat of introduced predators to our native species and the relationship between the short tailed bat and Te Pua o te Rēinga (Dactylanthus) is part of this story. The puppet show will be followed by a short talk from our Head Ranger about Te Pua o te Rēinga (Dactylanthus). Then we'll give you the opportunity to view this rare plant which is in flower at our reserve.

Entry to **Flutter** is by koha. For those wanting to see Te Pua o te Rēinga in flower, standard admission fees will apply.

On Thursday 25<sup>th</sup> April (Anzac Day) at 1pm we have a story telling session with local author Bianca Begovich.

Bianca is a children's writer and yoga teacher. She has published six books for children about caring for the environment through CreateBooks. All will be available for sale at Nga Manu as she reads her story 'The Earth and Me' on Thursday 25th April. She is also a published poet and in 2016 was awarded second place in the Rangitawa short story competition for her story about 'Koro Jack', an old whitebait who travels his local rivers and out to sea. She lives in Kāpiti with her husband, three teenagers, one dog, eight chickens and several thousand bees.

Entry is free for this session. Standard admission fees apply for those who wish to explore the reserve before or after.

We're also open every day during the holiday break from 10am to 5pm. For families we have concession passes available, which include entry for up to 3 children. Click <u>here</u> for more detail.
