Welcome back to Term 2. I hope everyone was able to enjoy the School Holidays and that families found or took some time to spend together as a family. The students and teachers have returned to school looking refreshed and relaxed. Visiting the classrooms over the past few days it is evident that the students have got straight back into the routines of school and that they are ready for another great term of learning here at Wadestown School.

Yesterday afternoon we celebrated our new Year 8 Leaders for 2024 at a dedicated assembly. This beginning-of-year Leadership Assembly is always a special one. Teacher PLD - Structured Literacy and Writing

We are continuing to work as a staff with our facilitator, Marianne Brown on Structured Literacy. Staff have been involved in a number of after school workshops that explicitly unpack the science of learning and take a deep dive into the progression of learning in writing. As this professional development continues, we believe that we will see further shifts and increases in student achievement in writing. This is both exciting and challenging work as teachers reflect on how they teach writing and the impact of this on their students.

At the end of this term parents and students will receive a mid-year report, followed by a Three Way Conference.

We are currently reviewing the information that we share with you through this mid-year reporting cycle.

Absenteeism and Lateness

While our overall school attendance is high we do monitor absenteeism across the school, as we know that there is an impact on students who miss large numbers of days from school. These absences lead to students missing key learning and in some instances, there can also be an impact on them socially too.

For us here at Wadestown School this has not seen any high level change as cell phones have not been part of our classroom culture and our students do a good job of managing these devices outside of school time.




